

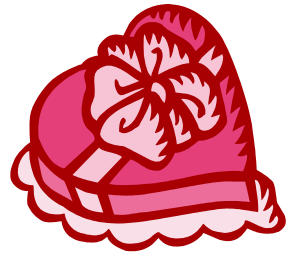

Area 2 Fishing Report

All SIR members and guests are welcome and encouraged to participate in the fishing trips as well as attend the monthly meetings. The next meeting will be February 22nd at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. The meeting starts at 8:30.

We have a lot more business than fishing to report, so let's start with the fishing.

At the December meeting, **Joe Peterson** showed pictures of the 43 pound salmon he caught at Duxbury the last week of salmon fishing. Big fish!!! **Don Mittelstaedt** reported on a 2 day trip to the Klamath and Trinity rivers catching small steelhead and trout. **Joe Karg** reported a striper trip to Broad Slough for small stripers. **Craig Walton** reported a trip to Sherman Lake for some stripers. **Carl Moyer** reported catching and releasing several sturgeon and stripers in a half dozen trips to the Mothball Fleet. All of that was before Christmas. Since then the cold weather and cold water have limited trips and stifled results. **Carl Moyer** reported 3 sturgeon attempts in Suisun with absolutely no fish caught or even hooked. With the outside temperature in the twenties this morning and a hard wind blowing, the near future looks very bleak. Several members attended the San Mateo Fishing Expo and reported a fun and interesting trip. There were some very good seminars, including the Cunang brothers seminars on salmon and sturgeon.

The business was much more productive. An ice fishing trip to Davis Lake is about to happen as soon as the ice thickens, **John Hayes** is fishmaster. Another trip was to the Sacramento Expo on January 18th. There will be a trip to the Pleasanton Fly Fishing show in late February, **Don Mittelstaedt** is fishmaster. There may also be expeditions to San Pablo Reservoir, the Delta for Stripers and Sturgeon in February, an outing to a

Seminar in Lodi in March, a house boat adventure on Lake Shasta, **Joe Karg** is fishmaster, and a Day at the Races in April. In May there are adventures to McSwain Reservoir, the Pitt River, and Lake Almanor, and trips to the American River for Shad, fly fishing for trout in the lower Sacramento, Norden/Soda Springs for trout, and a family social at an Irish pub in June. Quite a busy year ahead, the fish are in big trouble.

We would like to remind everyone that 2007 licenses are required, and the sturgeon rules are expected to change March 1st. At this time it appears that the slot limit will change from 46 inches up to 72 inches to 46 inches to 66 inches. Also there is a proposed punch card limiting fisherman to 3 sturgeon annually. The punch card is planned to be free and available at many outlets.

If you want to hear more, please attend one of our meetings. Near future meetings will be February 22, and March 22. Meetings begin at 8:30 at the Legend Sports Bar and Grill at the Diablo Creek Golf Course at 4050 Port Chicago Highway in Concord. Honoree of the Month Roland Scrivner

Our Branch 116 honoree for the month of February is Roland Scrivner. He has been a member of the Branch for over 10 years and has served as our Membership Chairman for the last four years.

Since 1983, he and Inez his wife of 54 years have lived in Rossmoor.

Roland was born in Kearney, New Jersey in 1929. After an uneventful childhood the family moved west to Berkeley, Calif. where Roland attended U.C. Berkeley for one year. Realizing he was not a very good student he applied for the Berkeley Fire Department and was hired in 1951. After spending two years in the U.S. Army he returned to the Fire Department and rose thru the ranks to become the Deputy Chief, retiring at the end of 1980.

At age 52 he started a second career in a field he had always been interested in, Acting. He gained an apprenticeship at Berkeley Reparatory Theatre and after appearing in several plays he received his Actors Equity Association Card for the roll of "The Judge" in "Nuts" at Theatre On The Square. As most actors soon realize, there is little money to be made in the theatre. One must ---get an agent, join "The Screen Actors Guild", "The American Federation Of Television and Radio Artists", and audition for work in movies and television. This he did and has appeared in several movies, two T.V. series, and a number of radio and T.V. commercials. The money is in screen work but Roland's first love is the stage and he still does that now and again. Working with such luminaries as Jeff Bridges, Martin Landau, Carroll O'Connor, Eugene Roche, and Vivian Vance is reward enough.

In addition to acting Roland has pursued a number of unusual interests.

In 1963, he and Inez using an out of work Contractor and several other Firemen, built a 3200 sq ft 'A' Frame home in the Berkeley hills.

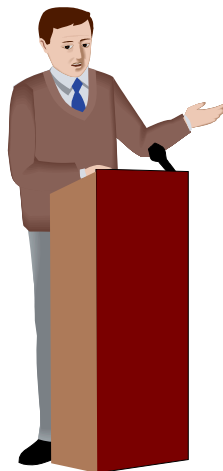
Because of his interest in woodworking Roland has been a volunteer supervisor in the Rossmoor woodshop for the last 23 years.
