## 18-Hole Golf Questionnaire

All the 18-Hole golfers recently had an opportunity to provide guidance to our Golf Committee on events and competition for 2017 via an electronic questionnaire.

44% of the golfers responded, which was an outstanding response rate and shows a strong interest and vitality in the golfing group. A summary of all the responses may be found on our golf website (branch116golf.org) in the "Welcome" tab.

A few "highlights", i.e., top vote getters (number enclosed in parenthesis) were:

- a. Have only two players sign scorecard; submitted scores are final (33)
- b. Revert to last year's flight arrangement with players choosing preferred tee (24)
- c. Offer a non-competitive flight for those not interested in earning points (18)
- d. Have Shotgun start events (26)
- e. Have Shambles and Scrambles (16)
- f. Bad Behaviors causing slow play:
  - i. Too much time looking for balls, often not their own (18)
  - ii. Sitting in cart and not dropping off (17)
  - iiii. To many practice swings (9)
  - vi. Fix: Emphasis on ready golf and keeping up with the group ahead (10)

It should be noted that there was an overwhelming response to the "Slow Play" question indicating a strong concern that needs to be addressed by all golfers. Slow play not only affects our SIR golfers who are playing but also can cause problems when scheduling future events.



## **Golfers Playing from Different Tees**

There has been a lot of discussion amongst our SIR golfers about competition between individuals playing off different tee boxes.

#### Background

When players are competing from different sets of tees, USGA Handicap Rule 3-5 requires that the difference in the Course Ratings of the tees be taken into account, by adding the difference in the Course Ratings to the Course Handicap of the players playing from the higher rated tees or, as we do in SMGA events, by subtracting the difference in the Course Ratings from the Course Handicap of the players playing from a forward tee (Yellow or White/Yellow). (Any Course Rating difference of 0.5 or greater is rounded upward.)

#### **Short Explanation**

The reason this adjustment is required is that a player's Course Handicap only focuses on the individual player. (Course Handicaps are determined from the Slope Rating of the tees being played without reference to the Course Rating). It doesn't take into account where other competitors are playing from. Because each set of tees has a different Course Rating, this difference needs to be accounted for when players are competing against each other from different tees.
