



A Moon for the Misbegotten will be staged in the Old Barn at the Eugene O’Neill National Historic Site in the hills above Danville on Sunday, September 25 for a matinée at 2:00 p.m.


Members of SIR Branch 116, Branch 128, and Branch 146 have joined together for this event. A special discount is available for members and guests of these SIR Branches.

Tickets are \$60 available on the Eugene O’Neill Foundation’s website. Information for access to the National Historic Site is available on the website eugeneoneill.org.

O’Neill is America’s only Nobel Prize-winning playwright. He lived in the hills above Danville from 1936-1944. “A Moon for the Misbegotten” was written during this period, and is perhaps O’Neill’s most popular play. The play has been presented frequently across the country, and on five occasions on Broadway since its debut in 1947.

In addition, a concert of traditional and contemporary Irish music at the Veterans Memorial Building in Danville will be the kickoff event of the 23rd Annual Eugene O’Neill Festival. Acclaimed Bay Area musicians Cormac Gannon, Erin Thompson, and Steve Gardner will vocalize and play a variety of instruments, including the fiddle and uilleann pipes. Book Group #1 just met on Monday August 22 to discuss "The Last Green Valley" by Mark Sullivan. The book illuminates the remarkable struggle of a family thrust into the chaos and destruction encompassing the German military's retreat from Russian

armies advancing through Ukraine in 1944 as part of a surprising, little known, World War II event of horse drawn wagon trains heading west referred to as the Long Trek.

From March 1944 to March 1947 the family endures military attacks, separations and prisoner camps until after braving dangers and seizing opportunities they are ultimately reunified in West Germany. The story is all the more remarkable as the author follows this very real family's continued journey to the United States and finally to the Green Valley of the Gallatin Mountains surrounding Bozeman, Montana.

Mac McLaughlin recommended the book while Steve Bort led the discussion with Art Donaldson, Mike Schneider, Paul Freitas, Dick Kauffman and Garrett Girvan. The group was greatly impressed with the resiliency of the Martel family in surpassing unthinkable roadblocks and conditions and generally liked the author's weaving of the story. The book received a strong positive rating of 4.1 stars.



Book Group 2

Book Club 2 members met August 18 to discuss The Night Watchman by Louise Erdrich.

In August 1953, the U.S. Congress announced a bill to abrogate nation-to-nation treaties, which were made with American Indian Nations for "as long as the grass grows and the rivers flows."

The bill would terminate the recognition of five tribes, including the author's grandfather (Thomas) who was the head of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa. Thomas worked as a night watchman for a factory where women of the Turtle mountain tribe worked using gemstones as drill bits for Defense Department Ordnance uses and for watches.

Among these working women is Thomas's niece Patrice. Thomas watches over the dark, possibly haunted factory, to protect these gems from thieves. The novel follows the fates, struggles and adventures of Thomas and Patrice, and their ever-expanding circles of family and friends.

On a 5 point scale, members voted a 4. score.
